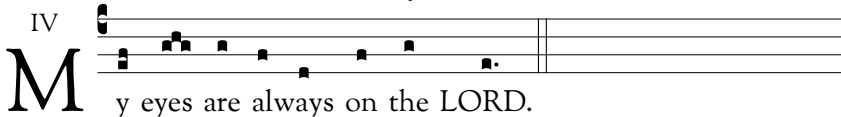

The absolution by the priest follows. ℞. Amen.



“For the water I shall give you shall become in you a spring of living water, welling up to eternal life, and you shall never thirst again.”





